WHEN YOU GRADUATE*

You'll leave Ready Arc with a minimum of **2 provincial welding tickets and 2 CWB tickets**, which allows you to work with pressure pipe and structural steel. Upon graduation, you'll write your **Block One Exam** - and will have already earned **900 hours** towards your first year apprenticeship.

* Must achieve 70% average in class work and pass the above welding tests to meet graduation requirements.

ENTRANCE REQUIREMENTS

To be eligible to apply, you'll need to be a high school graduate OR have obtained your GED OR be a mature student (20+) who has also graduated or obtained a GED.

WHAT HAPPENS NEXT

If you're ready to start the process and your journey to becoming a welder, complete the pre-application form and we'll reach out to answer questions, provide information, book an in-person interview and give you a tour of the shop. After that, we'll formalize your application and guide you through next steps.

STAR STUDENT Q&A

JACK KELLY

Jack came to us after his (honours) graduation from Hampton High, where his passion to pursue a career in welding was ignited by teacher, James Keleman. It was through a new government and industry-funded welding shop and the first-ever Metal Processing Class at Hampton High that Jack got started on his road to Ready Arc.



Jack was one of 8 students from his class to successfully test and receive CWB welder qualifications through Ready Arc's partnership with area high schools. Inspired by this, Jack's teacher pushed him to apply for the CWB Joseph G. Doria Exemplary Student Award. Jack was the only Canadian student, and first-ever Ready Arc student, to be chosen for this honour.

We chatted with Jack on graduation day about his experience...

WHAT WERE YOU UP TO BEFORE COMING HERE?

After graduating high school, I worked my summer job at Easy Kleen, an opportunity I got because of my high school welding class. It let me get some experience before I came here. My teacher also helped me apply for the CWB scholarship, which I ended up getting. That made my decision even easier.

WHAT MADE YOU CHOOSE READY ARC?

Steve's visit to our class to talk about welding and career opportunities, along with my teacher telling me that this was the better program helped make my decision. The fact that it's a shorter program with the ability to earn more tickets than other courses, plus the student success rates from past classes, made it a pretty easy decision.

SO, HOW WAS YOUR SIX MONTHS WITH US?

I love the teachers, I learned so much in the shop. We started with the basics, and once it got more challenging, I felt motivated to work at getting better. The instructors told us that they weren't going to babysit us to get our work done, but they were there to help every step of the way. It was our responsibility to get in that booth and work hard - you need the work ethic to get it done. I think that really prepared us to go into a job later and not be lazy or expect to be babysat.

I definitely want to be an industrial welder, ideally a pipe welder. I'm looking to get into an apprenticeship. I'm so pleased with how my experience here prepared me for the next steps in my life. It actually wasn't at all what I expected and it's clear that they want you to succeed. I definitely learned life lessons for the future.

STUDENT SUCCESS STORY

JENNA NOVAK

In the early days of her career, like many of us, Jenna moved around. From odd construction jobs to senior care and a diploma in Criminology, she tried to find just the right fit. As a single mother of two, there was a constant struggle to find a career to support her family. Finally, she had to make the difficult decision to look for work in Alberta while her children stayed with family in New Brunswick.



After four years of hard work as a welder's helper, travelling to and from Alberta, she was finally in a position to change her circumstances. She returned to New Brunswick and decided to pursue a career that would provide for her family while doing something she had come to love.

With a desire to make the most of her career, this self-driven single mom carefully weighed her options. Jenna saw that with the specialized welder training she could obtain through Ready Arc's 6-Month Welding Program, she could begin her new career. Everyday for six months, she made the 1.5 hour trek from St. Stephen to Saint John where she worked hard in the shop and excelled in the classroom.

While at Ready Arc she was able to gain certifications that most NB welders will readily recognize: F3B, F3(Approved), F3/F4(Approved), CWB FCAW (4 positions) and CWB SMAW (4 positions). She also passed her first-year block exam for welders and had 900 hours accredited to her apprenticeship.

Jenna's dedication to her goals, combined with her hands-on and specialized training, paid off. Immediately upon graduation, she landed an apprenticeship with one of New Brunswick's largest companies. This allows her to work, raise and support her family right here at home.

In 2017, Jenna was chosen to participate in the Regional Education Welder Apprentice Retention and Development (REWARD) program, created to help address a looming shortage in the skilled trades sector. It was developed to target recent welding graduates and provide them intensive training enroute to becoming a certified journeyman. Jenna worked her *a*** off through this program - and in 2020 she reached her goal of becoming a Red Seal Welder!



Now almost 7 years in with the same company, Jenna sits on the examination committee with her union. They work with apprentices throughout the apprenticeship process. Jenna mentors other female welders too, both in and out of the union, helping them establish their welding career and dial in their skills. Most recently, in 2023, Jenna's union chose her to represent them in Washington, DC for a Women in Trade Conference (all expenses paid!).

Jenna says, "Looking back it's all kind of surreal how far I've come since I took the leap to take the welding course. I just keep moving forward, and my journey all started with Ready Arc!"
